

What are Marine Protected Areas (MPAs)?

MPAs are special places in the ocean, similar to national or state parks on land, where people are encouraged to visit and explore, but where the take of wildlife and resources is limited.

Where are they located?

California's MPAs include dozens of sites on the coast, including Encinitas, La Jolla, Cabrillo and Imperial Beach.

MPAs will ensure that future generations will be able to enjoy the natural heritage of California's coastal waters.






